

English

Our focus text for this term is 'The Sister Who Ate Her Brothers And Other Gruesome Tales.' By Jen Campbell.

This book of traditional tales will enable the children to establish and develop an insight into the culture, geography and history of the countries introduced. It will also give the opportunity to develop the skill of oral storytelling. The meaning of the stories will be explored through role-play and through writing in role. There will be many opportunities for the children to develop their reader response by exploring interpretations of themes, plots and characters actions and motivations through discussion and debate.

The children will continue to develop their handwriting and will be set weekly spellings and grammar activities for homework.

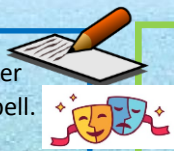
Topic- Ancient Greece

In History, we will be building on our existing knowledge of the physical geography of Ancient Greece. We will be developing our understanding of Ancient Greek society and recognising some of its impressive accomplishments. We will be learning how a civilisation that flourished 2,500 years ago continues to influence much of the world today.



Art and Design

In our Art lessons this term, we will be focusing on Monochromatic art. We will be using close observation when drawing, values to create form, select different pencils for different effects, use proportion when drawing, and use shapes to guide our observations and drawings.

RE

In RE this term, the new Big Question is 'Was the death of Jesus a worthwhile sacrifice?' where we will explore the meaning of sacrifice, evaluate what Christians teach about sacrifice and reflect on the significance for Christians of the death of Jesus at Easter.

PE

In Indoor PE, we will follow the Real Dance scheme. In outdoor PE we will develop our jumping, landing and balancing skills.



Computing

We will be looking at making fact file databases using research about Greece to categorise information in a data file.



Maths

Our focus topics for this term are:

1. Number: Decimals and Percentages
2. Measurement: Perimeter and Area

We will have lots of opportunities to use manipulatives and draw pictorial representations to help develop our understanding. We will all work on questions that develop our fluency, reasoning and problem-solving.

Early Work will be completing questions in our Mental Arithmetic books, which help develop our fluency and use of mental maths strategies.

Doodle Maths Assignments will be set as part of the homework, linked with that week's learning.

PSHCE

We will continue the Family Links programme, focusing on personal power, recognising and naming emotions, as well as exploring body language.



Science

Our science topic this term is Big Science. Over the term we will plan our own scientific enquiry, make predictions, take repeated measurements using scientific equipment, record data and results (using graphs), and interpret this data to draw conclusions. We will present our findings to the class and will invite parent visitors into the classroom too.
